Aiden Rafferty is 16 years old and is spending the next two months working on his newest film, *Nabakar*. He has finished learning his lines, and filming started this week. The young actor has already starred in three films - two of them for cinema and one specially made for television - as well as several theatre plays.

Aiden is very happy about being in *Nabakar* because he's working with his favourite actor, Kenny Ho. In the film, Aiden plays a teenage boy who dislikes his birthday presents so much that he builds himself a robot (called *Nabakar*). To his surprise, the next day the robot comes to life and starts to walk, talk and think for itself. Even better, *Nabakar* is small enough to fit inside the boy's pocket and goes everywhere with him. *Nabakar* is so clever that it tells the boy the answers to questions in class and helps him complete his homework. The boy's parents are very pleased when their son starts to do so well at school. They decide to take him on a visit to a flying museum, where *Nabakar* decides to try to fly a plane.

Aiden isn't allowed to be in the scenes when they are actually flying the plane because of his age - but flying is something he wants to learn to do when he's old enough. Some people say it's a sad story which has an important message, but Aiden's not so sure. 'When I first read it, I couldn't stop laughing. I think people who go to see the film will enjoy every minute of it,' he says.

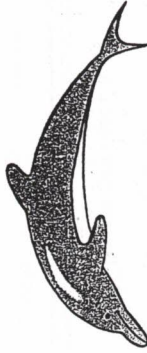
Questions 28-35
